

# Moral Dilemmas during the Covid-19 Pandemic

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#### Introduction

Royal Free Hospital has 34 ICU beds + 4-8 Surgical HDU beds

Part of North Central London Sector

HCID Centre with specialist ID department

Admitted over 400 patients with Covid-19 across the two waves



#### **Clinical Treatment**

A new disease!

Lack of evidence base

Sometimes got it wrong – e.g. negative fluid balance

How do we evaluate new treatments?



# **Family visiting**

During first wave, no visiting

Second wave, allow end of life.

Balance compassion to patient/relative with risk of harm to other patients/staff/relatives themselves

Issues over ensuring equity for all



#### **Triage/Allocation of Resources**

Decisions over who to admit

Encouraged early decision-making by medical team

Aimed for consensus amongst group

Trust Ethics group available



# **Exposure of Staff**

Concerns over PPE

Exposure to extreme pressures of working

Support wellbeing where possible at the same time as maintaining the service



### **Summary**

Several challenging ethical dilemmas in the ICU

Useful strategies were using consensus decisionmaking and sharing the burden of workload within the region

Supporting staff afterwards is critical
